## Description of the Commemoration of Martin Luther King, Jr.:

On November 2, 1983, former President Ronald Reagan signed into law House of Representatives Bill Number 3706 declaring January 15, the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., a national holiday.

In December 1985, former Penn State President Bryce Jordan formed a President's planning committee for Martin Luther King, Jr. recognition. Dr. James B. Stewart, director of the Black Studies Program at that time, served as the inaugural chair. The official recognition of this holiday began in 1986, and occurs on the third Monday in January each year.

Today, the MLK, Jr. Commemoration at Penn State is made possible by a dedicated group of students, faculty/staff, donors, and units across the university. This year's student sub-committee will be comprised of an executive director(s) and director(s) of Sponsorship, Public Relations, Student Organizations, Community Outreach, Campus Events, Day of Service, Evening Celebration, and Anniversary Task Force. ALL Penn State-University Park students are eligible to apply, although prior MLK, Jr. Commemoration experience is strongly encouraged.

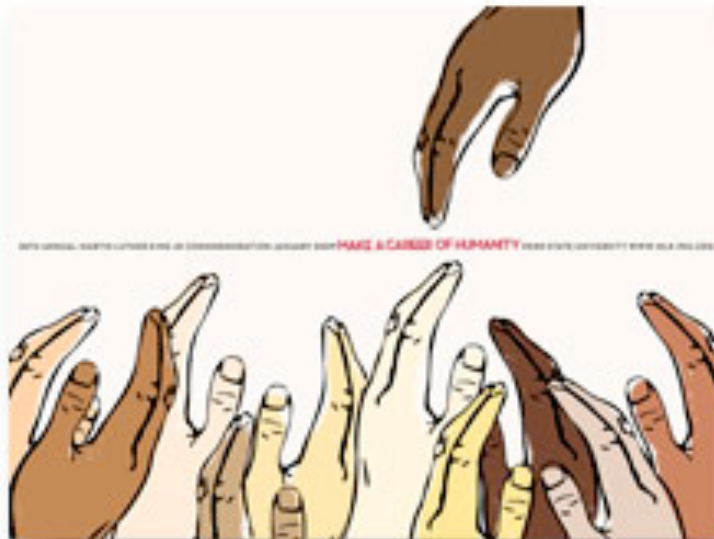
### **Expectations of the MLK, Jr. Commemoration Committee Members:**

The MLK, Jr. Student Sub-Committee members will be expected to commit to a year-long position, although the peak work time will be October-January. These members will be selected by the end of each Spring Semester, and expected to serve from the beginning of the Fall Semester until the next sub-committee is selected and transitioned in.

## Description of Events

- **Day of Service:** The MLK, Jr. Day of Service engages Penn State students in a national day of volunteer service on the King Holiday.
- **Social Justice Dinner & Panel:** The Social Justice Dinner & Panel, also held on the King Holiday, is a program developed to engage Penn State community members in conversation about issues of social justice.
- **Peace March & Service:** The Peace March & Service engages Penn State community members in a non-violent march for peace beginning at the Allen Street Gates and ending at the Pasquerilla Spiritual Center. Following is a peace service, featuring Penn State performers and speakers, which encourage those attending to reflect on Dr. King's values and ideals, particularly promoting peace and non-violence.
- **Evening Celebration & Keynote Speaker:** The Evening Celebration & Keynote Speaker is an annual celebration of the life and legacy of Dr. King featuring Penn State and State College community performances as well as a keynote speaker.
- **Penn State Art Competition:** New in January 2008, this competition is open to any Penn State student wishing to submit a piece of art that creatively represents the life and work of Dr. King. Art submissions are displayed the week prior to the King Day of Service, and members of the Penn State community are invited to vote on their favorite submission. Art displays are then displayed at future MLK, Jr. Commemoration events.
- **State College Area School District Short Story, Essay, and Speech Contests:** New in January 2009, the short story, essay, and speech contests for elementary, middle, and high school students respectively was developed as a way to better engage State College area students in programs honoring Dr. King's life and teachings.
